Application for an entry permit – photo and signature

Who can use this form

Use this form if:

- you are a member of the Committee of Management of an employee organisation or association and
- you have applied for an entry permit for an official of the employee organisation or association (the proposed permit holder) by lodging a Form F42 – Application for an entry permit and
- you have been asked by the Fair Work Commission (the Commission) to provide a
 photograph and the signature of the proposed permit holder for inclusion on the entry permit.

Lodgment of your completed form

Lodge this form with:

- the completed Declaration by the member of the Committee of Management and
- the completed Declaration by the proposed permit holder (including their signature) and
- a photograph of the proposed permit holder that meet the requirements listed in this form.

You can lodge your application by post, by email or in person at the <u>Commission's office</u> in your state or territory.

Glossary of common terms

Applicant – This is the person or organisation that is making an application.

Parties – A party is an Applicant, Respondent, or another person or organisation involved in a matter or case that is brought to the Commission.

Respondent – The person or organisation responding to an application made by an Applicant.

Service – Serving a document means giving a copy of the document to a person or organisation, usually to the other party to the matter. You can serve a document in a number of ways, including by email, fax, express or registered post, or in person. Parts 7 and 8 of the Fair Work Commission Rules 2013 deal with service.

Declare that:

1. I have provided a photograph of myself to the member of the Committee of Management named above (the member of the Committee of Management). The photograph meets the Fair Work Commission's requirements for entry permit photographs.



The Fair Work Commission's requirements for entry permit photographs are set out below.

An Australian passport photograph will meet these requirements.

- 1. The photograph must be less than 12 months old.
- 2. The photograph must:
 - show you facing the camera with your head straight, not tilted; and
 - show only your head and shoulders; and
 - show you with your eyes open and a neutral expression on your face; and
 - show you in front of a plain, light-coloured background; and
 - be in colour and in sharp focus: and
 - be well lit with no shadows and with strong contrast between your face and the background.
- 3. In the photograph you may:
 - wear glasses if you normally wear them
 - wear apparel covering your hair if you do so for religious or medical reasons.
- 4. If the photo is in hard copy it must:
 - show your face measuring 32-36mm from bottom of chin to top of head; and
 - be 45-50mm high; and
 - be 35-40mm wide; and
 - be printed on high-quality photo paper, at high resolution.
- 5. If the photo is in a digital format it must:
 - be in jpg or jpeg format; and
 - be in a minimum of 406 x 521 pixels; and
 - be less than 5MB in size.
